

# CODE OF CONDUCT

Your presence in the ACCP and participation in events of any kind in this space is tacit agreement to the rules laid out here.



## **Be respectful.**

Respect and dignity are essential to learning and research, and all scholar-gamers of the ACCP have the right to be treated this way. The ACCP is a respectful community where all ideas and interests are to be respected. While in this space, you may be faced with alternative viewpoints, ideas, and lifestyles; no one is to be shamed or derided.

The ACCP should be considered an ego-free space; video games can seem intimidating to those new to the medium, and all scholar-gamers of the ACCP are to be treated with generosity, kindness, and with an eye to collaborative curiosity.



## **The Intolerance of Tolerance.**

Please remember that personal beliefs that limit the autonomy or identity of others (such as racism or transphobia) are not acceptable; any behaviour that is deemed uncivil, disrespectful, discriminatory, harassing, or disruptive will not be tolerated and are grounds for immediate and permanent eviction at the discretion of the ACCP's co-directors.



## **Careful Treatment of the Space.**

The ACCP has taken significant effort to develop and the co-directors have worked diligently to create a safe and accessible space that offers access to a unique collection of modern and historical gaming systems. Use of the ACCP's resources should be done with care and consideration of this work. All users will be supervised while using the ACCP and are expected to clean up after themselves and ensure that our resources are secured after use. If anything is damaged during your use, please report it immediately to a co-director so that we can have it repaired.



## **Conscientious Reporting.**

If you have an issue with another scholar-gamer's behaviour, please address it to them privately (but only if you feel safe doing so) or speak with one of the co-directors. If it is one of the co-directors that you are concerned about, please approach one of the other co-directors; we will believe you and will take appropriate action. Our primary concern is to make the ACCP a safe place for scholarship, learning, and gaming.
